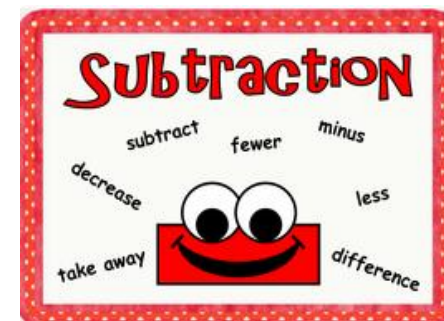

This week in MATHS:

Year 1s – using your number pairs to 10 from last week, write all the associated subtraction facts eg $10 - 3 = 7$ alongside the addition fact and learn them off by heart. See how easy it is to know lots of number facts!

Year 2s – pick a 2-digit number (or challenge yourself with a 3-digit number) and ask someone to give you a smaller 2-digit number that you can subtract from your first number. Record and do 5 each day.

This week in ENGLISH:

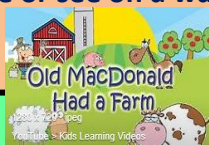

This week in SCIENCE:

Is the animal you chose last week a mammal, a reptile, an amphibian, a bird, a fish or an invertebrate? Name at least one animal for each group. In which group do animals you have at home or see on a walk fit?



Art/Design Technology:

Look at the list of animals you made in science. How many of these can you make using toilet rolls, egg boxes or other materials? Be creative and you can even make a habitat for them all to live in.

List the words you find tricky to read and practise writing them in shaving foam or with a stick in soil.

Year 1s – there are three digraphs which all make the 'er' sound – er, ir, ur. Can you write down 5 words using each of them? Year 2s – sometimes /or/ makes the 'er' sound like in – word or work. Can you think of any other words that do the same?
