In the opening scene we see an explorer in the frozen arctic. He is looking for someone, it is left up to us to decide who it is. The film then wanders back in time as the narrator/explorer recalls his days at University in Ireland where he studied under Professor Orit. (The man who is missing in the opening scenes.)

It brings us back to the present day and the predicament of the explorer. Who will he meet? Will he find the professor ever again?

- Rewrite the story recounting his days in the arctic.
- Describe the opening setting using similes, metaphors and personification.
- Rewrite the film as journal entries recounting the important events of the film.
- Write a newspaper report about the disappearance of the professor.
- Use maps to see where the voyage would take him.
- Extension: Rewrite the ending, maybe the explorer goes with the 'professor' and he shows him his workshop etc.
  - \*Keep writing in your diary!

- Test all of your times tables. Try using the inverse (dividing) too.
