

## MATHS:

We will be looking at ordering, recognising and matching numbers 1-5.

We will be recalling and learning familiar number songs and rhymes.

We will be learning to subitise with numbers 1-5. We will be learning to recognise and play with a range of 2D shapes.

#### HOW CAN YOU HELP YOUR CHILD?

Count everything! Steps, shoes, buttons on coats, toys etc. Play number games, concentrating on numbers to 5. Look out for words and numbers in the environment.

## **HOMEWORK:**

Read with your child every day and talk about the words they encounter, talk about the pictures and what has happened in the story. Talk about the changes you see around you in Autumn.
