searched that children who write fluently can use their working memory to create and compose their writing rather than concentrate on what the writing looks like.

In Year 3, when children's handwriting is fluent and joined they will receive their 'pen licence'. Pens should remain at school. Mrs Selbie will be beginning to check Y3 the first week we are back. Children then need to maintain a high standard throughout key stage 2 in order to keep it.

PCSO Kevin Williams

Yesterday our local PCSO came to speak to the Year 5 and 6 pupils about their actions and responsibilities. He talked about 'hate crime', anti social behaviour— bullying, abuse and intimidation. He emphasised to all the children that the legal criminal age of responsibility is 10 years old and from this age they can be charged and have a criminal record which would affect their future work and life chances.
