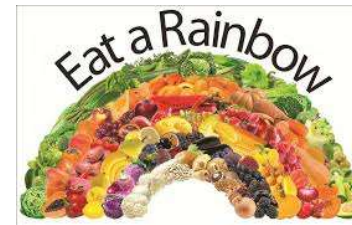
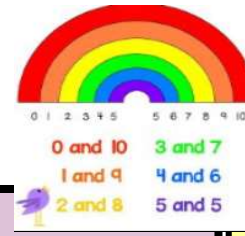


Summer Ideas Year 1

Outdoor Fun

- Go cloud watching and make a story about the cloud shapes and objects you see.
- Get to know trees – collect leaves and see if you can name the trees they come from.
- Get to know a bug – Has it got wings? Has it a shell? How many legs has it? Where does it live?
- Eat a picnic in the wild.
- Climb a huge hill or tor.
- Watch the sunset and take a photo or paint a picture of it.
- Get wet – in the rain or in a river or in the sea.
- Make a mud creation and decorate with anything natural eg twigs, pine cones
- Join nature's band – what sounds can you create in the open air eg run a stick along some railings.



Numbers

- How many 2D and 3D shapes can you make with baby marshmallows and toothpicks?
- Count in 2s, 5s and 10s when you are going up and down any steps.
- Make a rainbow of number pairs to 10 – learn them off by heart.
- Look at door numbers. Are they odd or even? What is 1 more / 1 less?

Reading and writing

- If you visit a favourite place, make a leaflet to encourage other visitors.
- Write a postcard to your new teacher telling them about the things you are enjoying.
- Visit Tavistock Library – challenge yourself and enjoy lots of books by doing the Book Track journey. You can collect stickers and badges as you do it.
- On booktrust.org.uk, go to Hometime, scroll down and click on Storybooks and Games. Explore and have fun!
- Read a book to every family member including your pets!

Arts and Crafts

- Create a course for a marble or a small ball to roll along eg using Lego, books, kitchen roll tubes.
- Make a windmill for your garden – paint it as brightly as you can.
- Have you heard of a dream catcher – have a go at making one and hang it in your bedroom.
- Make a kite to play with outside on windy days.
- Write secret messages using clear candles and paint or lemon juice and water. Just heat the paper once the lemon juice has dried.
- Make a treasure map and make it look old by staining the paper with teabags and tearing the edges.
- Paint a water scene inspired by Monet.



Cooking

- Invent your own pasta.
- Make your favourite pizza topping and put on bagels or French bread.
- Use shape cutters to help you make animal sandwiches and use vegetables and salad for their faces.
- Make a fruit kebab.
- Use your favourite fruit to make a smoothie or milk shake.
- Experiment making lollies – use yogurt, squash, fruit and fruit juice – can you make a layered lolly?
