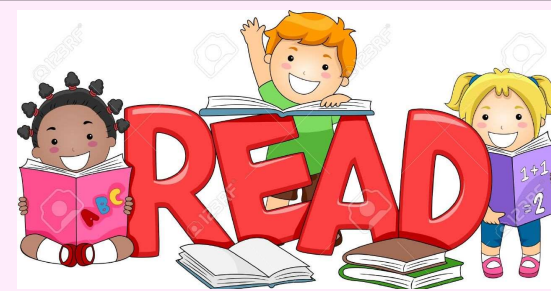

This week in MATHS:

Don't forget our non-negotiables – numbers have to be written the right way round. When you count objects you touch once and only once and say one number each time.

Put your beans on the table (start with 5, then progress to 10 and finally only if your child is ready extend to 20) Count them. Adult/peer covers some up. How many are left? Can you write a number sentence to show what is happening?

Use your Jack and the Beanstalk book and your story word map. Illustrate page 5 and write a sentence using your story board words and your phonic knowledge. (Do not copy whole sentences)

Reinforce capital letters, full stops, finger spaces, pen grip and cursive handwriting.

This week in STEM:

Can you make a new roof for Jack and his mum. It needs to be waterproof to stop the rain from coming in. Explore different materials to find the one that is most waterproof.

Art/Design Technology:

Learn the song 'And he Went Higher' with the Sarah Jane tutorial

Go into your garden or when out on your daily exercise for the day, collect small leaves and flowers. (Please wash hands when you have completed this activity) Sandwich what you have found between 2 pieces of sticky back plastic or cling-film. Turn it into a nature hanger and hang from a twig to decorate your house.

Understanding the World

My Place in the World. Get children to draw out 6 circles of different sizes. Label them and draw something to represent: My house, my town, my county, my country, my continent, my planet. Hole punch each circle at the top and attach together. Use photographs, maps and the internet to help.

Now add on an initial consonant : **spin**, **speck**, **step**, **trip**, **track**, **twin**, **clap**, **glad**
