Feedback and Marking

The way we teach is always changing, as research constantly provides better ways to help children learn. Every year we write a plan to make improvements to the children's learning experience and keep up to date with developments. This is called a School Improvement Plan. For the last few years we have been working on better ways to give children feedback on their work. Feedback is only any good if it helps children improve! Research has shown that the feedback that helps children know more and remember more is usually verbal and as immediate as possible, i.e. at the point when the children are trying out new The teacher wrote a little note: Where is learning and making the inevitable mistakes that come when we try new things. This is a long preamble, but I wanted to explain the thinking behind our decision to no longer write in children's books. Teachers continue to look at children's work, just as much, if not more than ever. However, the way they let chil-

dren know how they can improve has changed at Tavistock Primary and Nursery School. If you are interested, your child's class teacher can give you more information at parent consultations. You are also welcome to ask me. Mrs Alexander or Mrs Lashley when you see us out and about on the playground. Books will not be routinely available at this term's parent consultations, as this meeting is to talk about how your child has settled into their new class. but teachers might refer to work in children's books while they are talking to you, so I wanted you to be prepared! I think this poem (left) by Gervase Phinn illustrates the point better than any explanation from me.

Covid 19


Covid Symptoms

YOU MUST NOT COME TO SCHOOL if you have any symptoms of Covid 19. The legal rules for 10 day self isolation and testing continue to apply. If you are a close contact of someone who has tested positive for Covid 19 you should also self isolate, unless you are under 18 or have had both vaccines. You should test regularly throughout the 10 days, if you have been a close contact of someone who has tested positive for Covid 19. Please inform us if your child tests positive for Covid 19.

We are continuing with the recommended good hygiene regimes:

- 1. Ensure good hygiene for everyone.
- 2. Maintain appropriate cleaning regimes.
- 3. Keep occupied spaces well ventilated.
- Follow public health advice on testing, self-isolation and managing confirmed cases of COVID-19.
