
Reception Learning W/B: 8th June 2020



Funky Fingers

Practise your scissor skills by making paper dolls. Fold a piece of paper into quarters, accordion style. Draw a figure or person on the top layer. Be sure that the arms extend beyond the edges of the folded sheet. Cut the figure out and unfold. You will get a chain of dolls holding hands. Decorate and display.

This week in MATHS:

Use BBC Iplayer to watch an episode on Numberblocks daily. Concentrate on numbers 1-20.

Halving With a playdough cookie, pose a story problem about having to share it with a friend. How could you do this? Cut or break it into 2 pieces and keep the bigger 'half' yourself. Ask the children what they think about this. Present a range of materials such as paper shapes, string and bananas. Challenge children to halve them and then discuss and display the results.

What if you have to halve a box of four cakes? A collection of pennies? What if you have to halve a length of ribbon? A bottle of drink? Is there another way to fold a square of paper in half?

Can you write a list of things that you might see in your bucket? Now can you write a descriptive word to describe your object eg. shimmering mermaid. Now write a word after your object to describe what it is doing eg. shimmering mermaid splashing. Reinforce capital letters, full stops, finger spaces, pen grip and cursive handwriting.

Phonics/Spelling:

Practise recognition and recall of phase 2/3

graphemes. Practise segmenting and blending for

to words. Use a puppet to pull a word out of a bag. Sound talk the word and ask your child to write what they can hear. Does it match the puppets word? E.g. Stand, crisp, tend, trust, spend, blink, drank, trunk, grasp, blast, crunch, drench, spring, scrap.

reading and writing by adding sound buttons and bars

This week in **STEM**:

Can you make a flotation device for one of your plastic characters. You could use plastic, corks, wood etc.



Art/Design Technology:

Can you make a tropical fish out of a toilet tube. You could make more than 1 to make a tank of tropical fish.



Physical activity:

Over a distance of up to 10 metres and turning both ways: Starting in a seated/lying position, throw a bouncing ball, chase and collect it in a balanced position facing the opposite direction.
