Water Bottle Hygiene

PERSISTENT ABSENCE

The Department for Education define any child with attendance of less than 90% as a 'persistent absentee' and prioritises this group due to the damage caused to their educational opportunities.

In whole school assembly last week, we looked at the learning 90% means you miss: 1/2 day a week, 4 school weeks a year, 1/2 a school year across Key Stage 2.
