

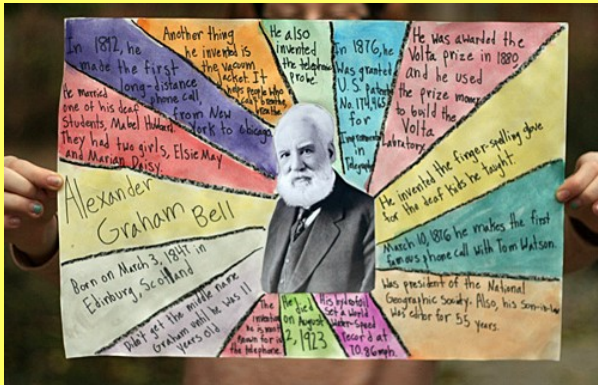


Week beginning: Monday 6<sup>th</sup> July

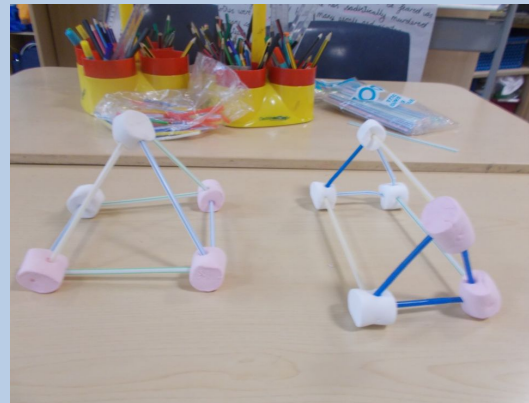


### Maths-

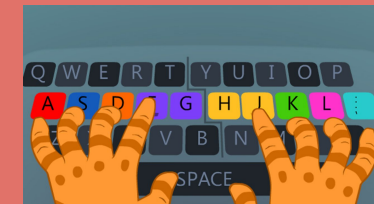
### Science and Foundation subjects
