



This week in MATHS: Odd and even numbers

Year 1s: Which numbers are odd and which are even? Where might you find groups of odd and even numbers in the environment? Is your house number odd or even? Are there an odd or even number of people in your house? Year 2s:

Investigate what happens with the following calculations:

- odd number + odd number
- odd number + even number
- even number + even number

Try lots of examples (use 1-digit and 2-digit numbers) and then tell your adult the rule you have discovered. Challenge them to prove you are right.

This week in Phonics/Spelling:

Year 1s - can you think of all the graphemes to make the /oa/ sound?* Make a list of words for each.

Year 2s - adverbs describe the verb; they describe HOW you are doing the verb e.g. backwards, cautiously. Think of your own and write some sentences.

This week in ENGLISH:

Read the book The Sand Horse by Ann Turnbull or listen to the story on the internet. How has the author described the white horses he sees in the sea and the sand horse he made? Make a list of the adjectives he used. Now imagine you have built something on the beach out of sand yourself. Be creative! Now write adjectives to describe your sand sculpture and use these to create interesting sentences. Year 2: also write a list of verbs explaining how you moulded the sand and use these in your sentences too eg smoothed, patted.

The Seaside

When you go to the seaside what clothes do you wear and why? Do you wear different clothes for different activities?
