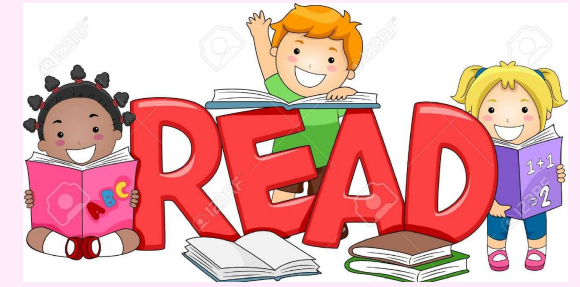

This week in **MATHS**:

Don't forget our non-negotiables – **numbers have to be written the right way round. When you count objects you touch once and only once and say one number each time.**

Use 10 magic beans and ask your child to share out the beans fairly and equally between you both. How many beans does each person have? Now model with more people/toys. How many beans does each person/toy have now? What happens when you have an odd number of beans?

Use BBC Iplayer to watch an episode on Numberblocks daily. Concentrate on numbers 1-20.

This week in **STEM**:

How can you make the tallest freestanding tower from just one piece of A4 paper? You can use a pair of scissors, but no glue or tape is allowed. Q. Is the tallest tower the best tower?

Understanding the World

Make a rainbow

1. Cut kitchen roll into the shape of a rainbow
2. At each end, use felt-tip pens to colour a rainbow about 2cm up from the bottom. Remember the order of the colours: red, orange, yellow, green, blue, indigo, violet.
3. Attach the paperclip to the top of the rainbow and tie a piece of thread to it. This will allow you to hold your rainbow.
4. Add water to the two bowls.
5. Hold the rainbow with both ends slightly submerged into each bowl of water and watch your rainbow grow.
