English Why not make a book this week? You could choose to make a book on any topic that interests you or if you are into story writing, why not write a series of books including a prequel and a sequel?

You could use a book you love to inspire you by writing another adventure for your favourite character. Or write a sequel or prequel to it. You could make a series of mini-books and see how small you can get them have a search for miniature books on the internet - they are fascinating. Read independently and keep a record of the number of pages you have read.

AIR - Think about a character you know well. Mke notes about where and what they would be doing in the future. Try hard to explain your answers, using evidence from the text to support your answers...

- · Listen to a story being read.
- Use the 5/6 spelling list (available in your home school diary or ordine) to practise how to spell them.,

Watch Newsround and discuss the topic with a member of your lamily.

- Practise your time tables on Rockstars, use Numbots for calculation practice
- · Practise multiplying and dividing by 10,100 and 1000 (up to tens of millions)
- Daily Arithmetic practice MyMiniMaths

#### Maths Game

Draw a 6 x 7 grid and fill it with numbers below a 100 like the one below.

- Roll a dice 3 times so that you have 3 different numbers.
- Use these 3 numbers to make one of the numbers on the grid.
- You can add, subtract, multiply or divide to reach one of these numbers. For example if you roll a 3, 4 and 6, you could do 4 x 6 - 3 to make 24.
- Mark the numbers to manage to calculate with a cross. Take it in turns with a friend of family member.
- The first one to get 4 in a straight line (horizontally, vertically or diagonally) wins!

Science and Foundation subjects

Investigate the structure of the Earth. Try to learn at least two facts about each of the three layers. Make up a mini quiz about it and test your friends and family - see who gets all of the answers right.

You could look back over all your home learning and design a longer quiz with different rounds? It would be interesting to see which family member has learnt the most!

For art, have a look at some portraits. Have ago at drawing portraits of your family members. This web site provides a tutorial on how to draw a face - you may want to practice this first.
