Imagine that you are one of the writers/creators of the new James Bond movie. You could create a storyboard for a chase scene between Bond and a 'baddie' - see how many onomatopoeia you can use. Write a chapter or two of the story, work hard on developing the different voices of your characters.

(Remember in your story, Bond doesn't have to be male!).

- Read independently and write a summary of one of your chapters.

AIR - What books with an adventurous theme have you read? What made the plot adventurous?

- Listen to a story being read.
- Use the 5/6 spelling list (available in your home school diary or online) to practise how to spell them. Use them in sentences showing you understand how to use it in different ways.

Watch Newsround and discuss the topic with a member of your family.

Exercise

Have you tried yoga or pilates? This is the week to give it a go! There are lots of videos on You Tube that you can use...it's harder than it looks! Happy stretching!

Maths

Keeping to the Bond theme: design an evil lair - Calculate the area and perimeter of three different rooms in your house. And use this to help you design an evil lair for your 'Baddie'. Label the area and perimeter or volume of the different sections that your 'baddie' wants to have eg, a shark tank indoors.

Challenge: Investigate how to calculate the speed of a moving object or how long it takes different cars to come to a stop. Can you use this to make calculations around a Bond chase scene?

Science and Foundation subjects

Create a poster to advertise your new Bond best seller. Design an outfit for Bond and for your 'Baddie'.

Design a gadget for Bond to use - think about how it will work and create a scientific diagram to explain it.

Music Project - Have a listen to at least three Bond theme tunes. Try and choose ones from different decades. Write a short appraisal of each one. Ask all of your family to make a prediction as to the artist who will make the next James Bond theme tune - collect them all in and keep them until the next film is released. (You can think of a prize for the winner!)

Decide on three settings from around the world that would make great locations for an action/adventure film. Research them and explain why you think they would be good. Try and locate real features that may have already been used in films.
