Dear Parents/Carers.

We have seen a rise in Covid cases across almost all year groups this week. The most important thing, at this point in the term, is that you all have a happy Christmas, with as few children and adults unwell as possible. To support this, we have cancelled the in-person audience for the nativity and will be posting a video of the performance for families to watch at home. Details of this will be sent out as soon as it is available. Last night we made the decision to change our end of term Christmas assembly arrangements. We will not be assembling in the church, but instead will have a Christmas assembly on our school playground. Parents of children receiving cups will be invited to attend, but the assembly is not open to any other parents.

Please keep testing yourselves regularly, children under 11 do not need to be tested unless they have symp-

toms or a member of their household has tested positive. Just in case you have missed the news this week, if you are a close contact of someone with a confirmed or suspected case of the Omicron Covid variant, you must isolate for 10 days even if you have had both vaccines and/or are under 18 years and 6 months old.

Government guidance for mask wearing is for children in year 7 and above. Masks are not permitted for children in our school, as they are too young to use them safely and effectively. Please see our risk assessment (available on our website) for further details.

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Tavistock Community Fridge

This is a sustainable food project run by volunteers; to stop edible food being thrown out by local businesses and redirecting it to be consumed by the local community, to reduce food insecurity, to encourage conversation and education around food wastage. They also aim to provide community connection through meaningful volunteering opportunities.



Some information on food wastage:

- Nearly a quarter of the food bought by UK households is thrown away. In terms of waste that is around 7 million tonnes to be disposed of.
- A further 1 million tonnes is lost by food businesses.
- The cost to the UK economy £13 billion a year.
- The food industry comes with a very big carbon footprint, 19 million tonnes of greenhouse gasses annually.
- Dealing with this waste effectively would be equivalent to taking 1 in 4 cars off the road.

Please be aware of new Covid guidelines in place

Targeted measures to prevent the spread of the new COVID-19 Omicron variant took effect from 4.00am on Tuesday 30 November 2021.

They are being introduced by the government as a precaution while more information is gathered and assessed on how easily this new variant spreads and any possible effect on vaccines.

The measures are temporary and precautionary, and will be reviewed in three weeks:

- -Face coverings are once again compulsory in shops and settings such as banks, post offices and hairdressers, as well as on public transport in England, unless an individual is exempt.
- -All contacts of suspected Omicron cases must self-isolate for 10 days, regardless of their age or vaccination status. They will be contacted by NHS Test and Trace.
- -Anyone entering the UK must take a PCR test within 48 hours of arrival and self-isolate until they receive a negative result. The PCR tests are available online from private providers.
- -Secondary schools pupils in England are being strongly advised to wear face coverings in communal areas. Due to high COVID-19 case rates in the south west, secondary schools across the region have been following this guidance since half term. The guidance applies to staff and visitors at all schools and childcare settings

Guidance for schools:

The Department for Education (DfE) has updated their guidance for schools and childcare settings to reflect new measures announced by the Prime Minister in response to the Omicron COVID-19 variant.

The new measures will be introduced as a precaution to slow down the spread of the new Omicron variant while the government gathers more information. The measures include:

- -Face coverings should be worn in communal areas in all settings by staff, visitors and students in year seven and above, unless they are exempt.
- -Pupils in year seven or above should continue to wear face coverings on public and dedicated school transport, unless they are exempt.
- -All educational and childcare settings should continue to encourage staff and students to test twice weekly using lateral flow device (LFD) tests.

Primary age school children should not wear a mask in school. If they wear it to walk to school it should go home with parents and not be brought into school.
