Dear Parents/Carers,

We are looking forward to welcoming you all into school for our parent consultation meetings in the week commencing 7th February. These meetings are a valuable opportunity to review your child's progress and understand how to support their education at home. Please make an appointment via our Parentmail system.



Children's books will be available for you to view during your visit. In preparation for this, I wanted to let you know about the system we are using for feedback in school, which we have been moving towards for some years now, but have fully embraced this year.

The way we teach is always changing, as research provides better ways to help children learn. Every year we write a plan to make improvements to the children's learning experience and keep up to date with developments. This is called a **School Improvement Plan.** In line with this, we have changed how we feedback to children.

Teachers do not write in books, put in stamps or add ticks or other marks. Please be reassured that this does not mean teachers are not reviewing children's work, feeding back to them on what they need to do to improve and teaching to misconceptions they have identified in children's understanding. The most effective feedback is given 'in the moment'; in other words during the lesson while the teacher is teaching and the children are learning. It will occur during responses to children's contributions to teachers' questions, during discussion or when teacher and child look at recorded work together. Feedback is only any good if it helps children improve!

If you have any questions or queries about how this works, your child's class teacher will be happy to explain further during your consultation.
