This week in ENGLISH:

Read the story 'The Tiny Seed' by Eric Carle or listen to it on YouTube. Draw 6 pictures to sequence the events of the story and write in your own words the story of the seeds journey. Can you tell the story to someone in your family?



Phonics/Spelling:

Challenge yourself to spell 10 things you can see from your window or in your garden. 2 of the words should have 6 letters or more! Write a sentence to include each word.

This week in **SCIENCE**:

If you have some seeds, try growing them in different conditions – keep a diary to show what happens.

Look out of your window or in your garden

– what is growing? Draw a labelled diagram.

Art/Design Technology:

Use paint or felt tip pens to cover a sheet of paper in shades of yellow and orange. Then cut out 6 large petals and stick down to create a sunflower collage. What could you use to make the stem, leaves and centre part of your flower? Does it look like the sunflower on the front of Eric Carle's book?

Plants like to be spoken to! Choose a favourite book and read it to a plant.

Music:

Make a shaker using seeds or dried pulses. Use to play a rhythm or beat and dance along to your favourite songs.
