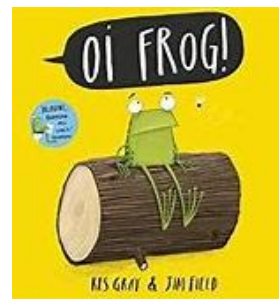




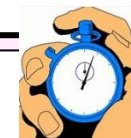

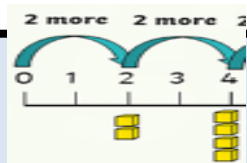


Counting in seconds.

This week in MATHS:

Counting in 1s, 2s, 3s, 5s, and 10s

This week in SCIENCE:

Do you know what season it is? What months are in this season and what happens in nature during this time? Can you write some clues to describe each season? Ask a family member to solve the clues.

Music:

We all know the song '5 Little Speckled Frogs', so teach it to someone in your family. Now get creative and make up your own song about a frog.



This week in Geography:

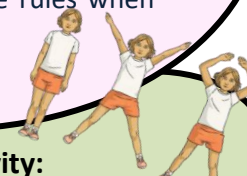


This week in ENGLISH:
