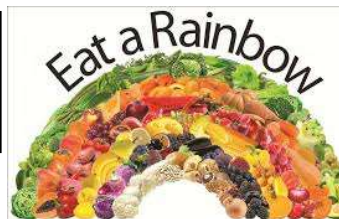




Summer Ideas Year R

Maths

- Solve problems using numbers to 20.
- Look and use numbers in your local shop.
- Learn to recognise your numbers up to 20 out of sequence.
- Challenge yourself to count up to 100 and/or find one more and one less than a number to 10/20/100.



Physical Development

The summer holidays are the perfect time to master a new skill.

- How about removing your stabilisers and seeing if you can master riding your bike? Remind your child that they will need to persevere and with a little bit of practise each day they will be heading towards a new sense of freedom!
- Tie your own shoelaces
- Get yourself dressed in the morning.



English/Communication and Language

Keep a simple diary of your summer holiday. Write one short sentence a day. You could stick in artefacts, nature objects, photographs or tickets.

You could write a letter or postcard to a classmate, family member or friend.

Understanding the world:

- Learn to identify local trees and flowers
- Learn how to skim a stone
- Spot a fish
- Set up a snail race with your family
- Go star gazing
- Climb a huge hill
- Make a home for wildlife



Phonics/Spelling

- Embed phase 2, 3 and 4 tricky words
- Blend and segment your phase 2 and 3 sounds in the front of your reading diary.
